Recently, Fox News reported on a deeply disturbing discovery in Ireland. The remains of over 800 babies and young children were found buried in what

has been described as an underground sewerlike system. These children died over the course of several decades in a home for unwed mothers called St. Mary's Mother and Baby Home located in the city of Tuam. This was a place that was meant to shelter the vulnerable, yet it became a site of neglect, loss, and now, national grief.


Ireland's Prime Minister and many others have publicly expressed shock and sorrow over this tragedy. In fact, in 2021, the same Prime Minister acknowledged that over 9,000 children had died in similar institutions over a span of about 40–50 years. The emotional reaction to this historical injustice is valid, and the call for dignity in death is just.

As I read this story, I felt not only sadness, but outrage. Why? Because today, in modern Ireland, over 10,000 unborn children are aborted every year. That's nearly 20% of all pregnancies. These unborn children also died terrible deaths. These unborn children also received no burial. Their remains are not recovered nor identified. There is no call for DNA analysis or for dignified funerals. There is no national mourning for them.

The very people who are grieved and outraged by the tragic disposal of children from decades past - including the Prime Minister of Ireland - are often the same ones who defend or remain silent about the systematic termination of thousands of unborn children today. There's a profound moral disconnect here. If the horror that took place in Tuam (or in other cities like it) lies in how those young lives were discarded, then how is the modern-day disposal of 10,000 unborn children each year not even more tragic?




We cannot claim to value human dignity and simultaneously ignore the silent destruction of thousands of voiceless lives. We cannot mourn the children of the past while justifying or ignoring the fate of children in the present. Selective outrage is not true compassion. True compassion is consistent. It values every human life—not just when it's politically or socially convenient.

FROM THE HEARTS OF BIRTH CHOICE VOLUNTEERS

"You are now entering the mission field." I remember that sign at the exit of a childhood friend's church. My husband and I both thought we'd be serving Jesus overseas by now, but God had other plans (just like always, right?). I had to change my mindset - Jackson was my mission field for now.

Looking for ways to use my Neonatal ICU nurse license locally led me to Birth Choice over a year ago. Having met so many new moms in the hospital with babies as young as 23-24 weeks, I was familiar with many of the fears, dreams and questions our clients have. There is one big change, though: in the NICU, the mom can only see her sweet baby; in Birth Choice, she can only "see" her problems, her morning sickness, her boyfriend, her financial concerns. In those quiet rooms, my mission is to start with what she sees, but lead her to what I can see. Not just a little ultrasound squiggle with a heartbeat, but also her heart.

Many of our clients are already intending to parent their babies, and only need a hug, access to resources, or someone to cheer them on (all very valid needs!). But often she has overlooked a bigger need: Jesus. Volunteering at Birth Choice gives me the joy of helping women, one by one, week by week, to see not only the little life inside them, but the way to the Eternal Life. What sweeter mission field could I ask for?

After I had retired from teaching and the Epilepsy Foundation, God answered my prayer of wanting to be a grandmother. What pure joy and blessing - three times!! That experience of holding and hugging my Grands, well there are no words. God laid that feeling on my heart and planted that seed of wanting to serve Him in a unique way. Of course I had heard of Birth Choice and the incredible work being done by them in Jackson. As I inquired more about BC, God continued to tug on my heart. So, I inquired, got an application, sent it in and was interviewed, and asked to join. I want to say how impressed I was with the application-I know. Impressed with an application? Let me explain. The application is just not random questions. It asked questions concerning my spiritual life, my thoughts on abortion, adoption, birth control, and other questions pertaining to the work I would be doing.

My first client after my training was a lady with four children and the youngest one was 8 months old. She had no support whatsoever and thought her only option was abortion. But what that broken hearted woman found was open arms, open hearts, correct information and prayers. During her ultrasound we found out she was having twins! This lady who came with one thing on her mind left with two in her heart and adoption information in her hands. She contacted the adoption agency and they lovingly assisted her in this process. During her journey she gave life to two girls and provided an amazing gift to a couple who had prayed for a baby for several years. God doubled that prayer!

There is nothing like the experience of seeing a woman's face when she makes the decision to give life to her baby, hearing the Gospel maybe for the first time, being prayed over, and seeing the genuine love and care from everyone at Birth Choice. What joy it gives my heart to know that another woman will get to experience holding their grandchild as God blessed me.

FROM THE HEARTS OF SOME OF OUR CLIENTS

When clients leave our office, they are asked to fill out an exit survey. These are several comments they shared about their experience at Birth Choice:

"Seeing the baby for the first time made me...happy and ready to be a mom. I received the best help and advice from the nurses. Everyone was nice, respectful, helpful, and caring."

"[I was so] happy to see my little bundle of joy! [The staff at Birth Choice] was nice, [they] took time out to talk to me and point me in the right direction as a first-time mom. [They were] very polite and nice." "[Coming to Birth Choice] helped [me] make the right choice.... The help I received helped me make the choice I truly wanted. The people here are kind and not judgmental." This woman was considering abortion when she came in. She changed her mind and chose life for her baby.

"I really loved the comfort I was given and the gift of a Bible made me cry; that's the best gift [I] ever receive in my life. Thank you."

Sometimes in ministry, it's easy to feel discouraged and wonder if our time could be better spent elsewhere. But Galatians 6:9 reminds us, "Let us not grow weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."

The small things we do—especially on the mobile unit—may seem insignificant in the moment, but they matter. Recently, I've been reminded just how meaningful these acts can be, and I want to share a few powerful examples with you:

• One client told me she was terrified to visit the doctor because she suspected something was wrong with her pregnancy. After texting with us, she found the courage to go. Although the outcome was heartbreaking, she found comfort in the small silicone babies we give out to represent a 10 to 12 week gestation. Something so simple became a source of peace for her.

- Another client had a premature baby who is now thriving. She later texted us saying that the abortion information we shared changed her mind—and she is pro-life now!
- And just recently, a mother came in with her daughter. She shared that when she was 16, she visited our Jackson clinic and received a pair of crocheted baby booties. She kept them all these years. Now, her daughter—who first came to us three years ago—returned, this time visiting our newest mobile unit in Milan.

These stories remind us that no work done in Jesus' name is ever wasted. Every conversation, every handout, every small act of kindness is used for the advancement of His Kingdom. Keep going—you never know the harvest God is preparing.
